7. How did God provide for the needs of man and woman?
  
8. Re-read Genesis 2:16-17.
  - a. What significance do these verses have on our understanding of humanity’s freedom of choice?
  
9. What does this passage teach you to do?
  - a. Using sentences beginning with “I will...” write down actions this passage calls you to do.
  - b. For example, You might say, “I will trust that God made me good.”

6. What do you find most interesting in this section?
7. What additional questions do you have?
8. What does this passage teach you to do?
  - a. Using sentences beginning with “I will...” write down the actions this passage calls you to take.
  - b. For example, you might say, “I will enjoy God’s blessings”
