

Open Book Test

Students differ greatly on the idea of open book tests. For some it is a “no-brainer” to have a test where the answers are right there in front of you. “All you have to do is go get them”, says one student. Another student has quite a different outlook.

This student complains that the test is far too long and the detailed answers are far too difficult to find. This means the test requires the student to slow down a bit and concentrate more. The complaining student finally reveals the fundamental problem... To do well on an open book test, you must have familiarity with the book. This means the teacher has been expecting the student to keep up with assignments and be familiar with the book.

It has been said by some academics that being able to know where to retrieve the information can be as important as knowing it. When we have learned things, we can, over a period of time mistake details that can be very important. We may have heard something somewhere and mistakenly believe it to be truth. Going back to the fact listing has proven to be immensely valuable in areas of science and mathematics.

Men have often been ridiculed as the gender that does not like to read the instructions. “Just put it together as it appears” could be hailed as the motto. Could this practice be why we have so much religious division? Have we been putting together the Lord’s church from the pictures we have in our minds? What if the pictures are a bit out of focus and we lose many details from a lack of depth of field? How do we get the full picture?

Perhaps, religiously speaking, we have been failing the open book test. Instead of going to the book for the answers we have created a problematic system of division. We look at the world round about us and suddenly we cannot defend the faith because there are so many “faiths” and we do not want to hurt the feelings of those who have missed vital parts from the instructions.

One vital part missing from the instruction Book is a practice of saying the “Sinner’s Prayer.” We know we are all sinners, (Romans 3:23). We know that sin is an offense against God, (1 John 3:4, Psalm 51:4). We understand that since we have broken the law we must pay a price and that ultimate price is hell (Romans 6:23). What must we pay? We do not have enough. Jesus on the other hand, with innocent blood, paid the price for our sin, (Matthew 27:4, 1 Timothy 2:6, 1 John 4:10). How do we get in the group for which Jesus paid the ransom? Some say, “Just accept Jesus as your personal Savior”, and others add, “Say this prayer with me” and yet the prayers are not the same. “Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever,” (Hebrews 13:8). The “Sinner’s Prayer” in any form does not show up in the book as THE METHOD of salvation. Could it be that we have stopped reading the instructions at the point where a penitent heart recognizes God and asks forgiveness?

The word “repentance” is translated from a Greek word that means “to have a new mind.” Certainly this “new mind” recognizes its position before God and has a desire for and asks for forgiveness. This “new mind” takes action. Considering a new behavior starts us on the path but if we do not change our behavior, the consideration is a waste of time. This, “new mind” will go back to the Book and find all the instructions. Jesus tells us that we must publically acknowledge Him as the Son of God (Matthew 10:32; Example: Acts 8:35-37). Jesus tells us that we must be baptized, (Mark 16:16; Examples: Acts 2:38, 8:38, 22:16). At the point of baptism, we come in contact with the blood of Christ (Romans 6:3-4). Having done all that God has commanded, we walk this life as new creatures (2 Corinthians 5:17, Galatians 6:15).

When we are assembling anything and finish with many parts left over, we know that something is wrong. Although, we may joke about it, we know that we must take a closer look at the instructions.

God is giving you and I an open book test every day that we live. He has provided us with everything we need to live justified in His sight and joyfully while here (2 Peter 1:3). It is no laughing matter to put our lives together without the instructions. Spend some time with God’s word and look for those things that burden your heart. God has the answer.
