Sin is Rebellion Toward God

Define rebellion - re•bel•lion \ri-'bel-yən\ *noun*(14th century) **1** : opposition to one in authority or dominance **2 a** : open, armed, and usually unsuccessful defiance of or resistance to an established government **b** : an instance of such defiance or resistance (Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary)

Greek Definition of rebellion - to rise up in open defiance of authority, with the presumed intention to overthrow it or to act in complete opposition to its demands—'to rebel against, to revolt, to engage in insurrection, rebellion (Greek- English Lexicon)
