Termites in the Church

One Sunday many people gathered in an old wood frame building. The floor creaked as it did each week. The aroma of the years on the wood permeated the room with the perceived echoes of the past. The ladies smiled at one another while the men considered their awesome responsibilities to participate in worship of the Almighty God. Taking their seats in a quiet orderly manner, there was a sense of reverence as each person guided his mind to the task at hand. Finally, all the regulars were present and then something terrible happened.

The floor kept creaking once everyone was still. The sound of little snaps went on for about a minute as if to warn the church goers what was about to happen. Suddenly parts of the floor gave in and people fell two to three feet through splinters to the ground. Next, as if buzzards circling the dead, flying bugs filled the room. The ladies could not continue to be gracious when caught in this predicament. The men had their minds ripped from reverent worship to the rescue of the women and children in surprise and fright.

Once all were safely outside, a few of the men inspected the damage and found the structure had been overtaken with termites. The problem was their silent work was undetected by most. The two men who warned that the creaking floor and the aroma of the room indicated a problem found no joy in being right. Now the damage was done.

For some the old meeting place would never be the same, even after repairs. Those who could not shake the image of the collapsed floor would just never return. Others wanted quick patches and repairs to pretend the collapse never happened. The faithful few rolled up their sleeves and worked at treating the termites and the moisture underneath the structure.

In as much as a physical building where the saints meet can have problems, the church may also have some undetected termites. The Bible makes it plain that the church is the people not the building. "And great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things" (Acts 5:11). A building cannot fear. Neither can people really be infested with termites but there are those quiet undetected bugs from Satan that weaken us with the intent to destroy us.

Jealousy and Anger are two of those dangerous bugs. Jesus shares with us a parable in order that we may consider our own behaviors.

For the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard. And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way. Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise. And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle? They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive. So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first.

And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny. And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house, Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day. But he answered one of them, and said, Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny? Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee. Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? Is thine eye evil, because I am good? So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen. (Matthew 20:1-16)

We cannot afford to waste the precious time God has granted us being jealous or angry. This behavior will cause us to create an atmosphere that does not accept "strangers" who have come into the vineyard lately. Jealousy and anger will eat away at the Lord's work like termites in old wood.

We must treat for these and other destroying bugs with love exemplified by Christ Himself. Here is the treatment plan: Step one - "We love him, because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19). Steps two and three - "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. 38 This is the first and great commandment. 39 And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" (Matthew 22:37-39).
